

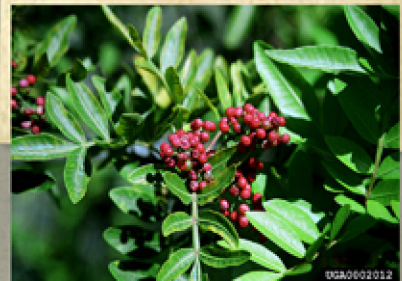
HELLO PORT ARANSAS. GOODBYE BRAZILIAN PEPPERTREES.

WHAT'S THE ISSUE?

- ▶ Brazilian peppertree (*Schinus terebinthifolius*) is a non-native invasive species in Texas.
- ▶ The species displaces beneficial, native vegetation by forming dense thickets, shading out other plants.
- ▶ A relative of poison ivy, Brazilian peppertree can cause dermatitis in sensitive persons.
